

RIDER

This rider sets up additional terms and conditions for **Women Who Made Music History Concerts, LLC** and is binding as an accompanying part of the contract for the event: **Love is a Rose, Celebrating the Music of Linda Ronstadt.**

FULL BAND version = 4 musicians + 2 Singers

Date of Show: Saturday, February 9, 2019

- **1. Dressing Room:** If available, a green room with comfortable sofas, chairs with access to separate restrooms with at least one electrical outlet and shower.
- **2. Hospitality:** 7 meals that includes protein, vegetable and dessert after completed sound-check or 7 x \$20.00 for meal buy-out
 - Water, Hot water for Tea and access to coffee as well as fresh fruit, cold cuts, cheese plates on hand for snacking during and after show.
 - Minimum 12 bottles of cooled non-carbonated water for stage and backstage
- **3. Arrival and Parking:** Please provide detailed directions two weeks before the date of the show with the complete address of the venue and a telephone contact. We need a safe parking space available for the vehicle(s) close to the stage and venue. Please provide arrival, sound-check and

doors-open and on-stage times. The promoter or another person should be at the venue at arrival time.

- 4. Accommodations: If accommodations are provided, a Hotel of good quality should be secured near the venue. Reservations should be for four (4) double occupancy (2 for acoustic version) non-smoking rooms. All rooms should be guaranteed for late arrival, please.
- **5. Ground Transportation:** If artists are traveling by air and Promoter/Buyer is providing Ground Transportation, the vehicle(s) should be large enough to accommodate six (6) band members, with luggage and instruments including an upright bass in 61.5" long flight case.
- **6. Stage:** Promoter/Buyer shall provide a COVERED STAGE for outdoor event when applicable, which will protect the Artists from the elements. Three small tables or chairs to be used to place capos, tuners, drinks, hand percussion instruments. (1) Between lead vocalists on stage, (2) Behind artists on back of stage.
- **7. Sound and Lighting:** We prefer an overall natural sound with medium processing and effects to be worked out during sound check. Optimum mix for vocalists MAINS AND MONITOR should include reverb and when applicable, short delay. Promoter/Buyer shall provide a professional quality lighting system for any indoor event or for any outdoor event when performance will occur near or after sunset. Lighting can be discussed during sound-check, though generally, lights brighter during up-tempo songs and lower during ballads. It is important though that during the show there is always sufficient light for the bass and guitar players to see the fretboard of their instruments.
- **8. Multi Media Slide Show/Audio Clips:** Promoter/Buyer will provide necessary feeds to incorporate a short media slide show consisting of up to four (4) still photographs to be projected onto a backdrop screen, four (4) different times throughout segments of the concert performance. In addition, Sound Engineer will play on cue by Artist from stage, two (2) separate audio clips of no more than fifty-one (51) seconds, two (2) times -1^{st} time: at the top of the show; 2^{nd} time: at the top of the 2^{nd} set or half way through a 1-set show.
- **9. Opening Act:** Artist reserves the right to approve any opening act for any regular concert event. No more than one (1) opening act shall appear at any regular concert event and shall not perform a set exceeding thirty (30) minutes unless otherwise mutually agreed upon within the Concert Contract. This does not apply to Festival Performances.
- **10. Set Schedule:** If artist is scheduled to perform MORE THAN ONE (1) set in a day, the maximum time between sets shall not exceed 4 hours.

11. Billing: Artist shall be billed as: Love is a Rose, Celebrating the Music of Linda Ronstadt and receive headline billing in any advertising/publicity. Artist shall close the show at any regular Concert Event. Artist does not require to close the show, at a Festival performance.

13. Payment:

- a. All payments to artist shall be made payable to Epic Arts Management, LLC
- **b.** Final payments made in person on day of show should be made to either Peggy Ratusz or Paula Hanke in a secured, private area which cannot be observed by anyone.
- **c.** If Promoter/Buyer fail to make payments in the timeframe stipulated, Artist shall have the right to withhold concert performance.
- **14.** Audience Control: Promoter/Buyer shall make a reasonable effort during the performance event to maintain an orderly listening audience and safe performance environment.
- **15. Sound and Staging:** Promoter/Buyer agree to provide a professional Sound Engineer and professional-quality Sound System including four (4) Vocal Microphones and six (6) separate monitor mixes.

17. Recording: Live Audio taping, videotaping or broadcasting of the Love is a Rose show/event is prohibited by audience members or event staff without express written consent directly from Artist.

18. Cancellation:

a. The Artist's obligations herein are subject to detention or prevention by sickness, accident, means of transportation, Act of God, riots, strikes, labor disputes, epidemics, any official order or act of public authority, or any other cause similar or dissimilar, beyond Artist's control.

b. If this event or WWMMHC's portion of this event is not presented on the day and time scheduled due to inclement weather, the Artist shall be paid in full, provided Artist is present and ready to perform.

19. Merchandise:

- **a.** <u>Promoter shall provide one (1) table and one (1) chair</u> in an area near the stage, venue lobby, or other appropriate <u>visible area</u> for Artist merchandise to be displayed and sold.
- b. Artists retains 100% of merchandise sales if artists provides a seller. Promoter retains % of merchandise sales, if artist fails to provide seller. All proceeds made through sale of merchanise, is payable to Artist directly after the show. Cash accepted as well as check made out to Paula Hanke.
- **c.** Artist owns all rights to the name/image/likeness of the band for Love is a Rose and holds the exclusive right to sell and profit from any merchandise bearing the name/image/likeness of the band for Love is a Rose. Artist reserves the right to confiscate any merchandise held by any vendor which violates said rights.
- **d.** Should Promoter/Buyer wish to create any merchandise for event which incorporates the name/image/likeness of the Love is a Rose band, a written request must be submitted to Artist. Any permission granted and terms agreed upon will be documented in a written agreement separate from the Contract and Rider.
- **e.** The name Love is a Rose, Celebrating the Music of Linda Ronstadt, shall not be associated directly with any product or service without express written consent Artist.
